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## **Introduction**

Welcome to the Leicestershire Road Club .

The Club aims to encourage all forms of cycling, irrespective of age, sex, race or ability. We offer membership of a thriving, active group of energetic, responsible people contributing to a healthy, outdoor sport.

The Club activities include all forms of racing, touring and Club rides. The social side includes activities centred on our own clubroom, and an Annual Dinner Dance, which allows us to honour the successes of racing members.

Many members have a keen competitive spirit, which we positively encourage. The strength of any club, though, should always be measured in the depth of its abilities, rather than just in one or two individuals, and with many of the older members still keen and active, we have a large pool of experience and expertise on which to draw.

The Leicestershire Road Club is very active in local promotions, and every year run several races attracting riders from all over the country to compete at varying distances on the road. The off-roaders are not forgotten, with frequent mountain bike and cyclo-cross races and a thriving off road section.

In the summer, evening races on and off the road or track are ideal introductions for new or younger members. Realising that the (oval) track side of the sport can be both difficult and expensive for a novice to enter, a collection of specialist (oval) track bikes are available for members.

The club also contributes to the organisation of the sport with members sitting on various national cycling bodies at all levels. We take a responsible attitude to cycling on the public road by insisting that all active members belong to either “British Cycling” (BC) or the “Cyclists Touring Club” (CTC), both of which provide government representation and insurance benefits.

So whether you are an existing member or a newcomer, we hope that you will find this guide both useful and informative.

## HISTORY

The Leicestershire Road Club is Leicestershire's oldest and most prestigious cycling club, and continues to be so.

The Club began life as "The Leicestershire Road Club and Records Association" following a meeting of twelve cyclists held on February 19th, 1909 at the Bell Hotel, Leicester. The name was modified to its current form two weeks later.

The first chairman was Mr HE Winks, and at a general meeting on April 16th 1909, Mr Hales was nominated to be the first President, but never took office. This position was taken by Mr HE Winks at the first AGM the following year.

From that small initial group the Club has gone from strength to strength and now boasts a sustained membership of over 160. The success of the Club has been seen, not just in its growth, but also in the achievements of its riders in competition.

The Leicestershire Road Club has a very long and proud record of racing successes in every sphere of the sport and it is for this that we are most famous. Success has come to our riders in the shape of Local, District, National and World Championship medals.

Some of our riders have reached the pinnacle of the sport by becoming National and even World Champions and Professional riders yet have still retained their membership of the Club.

You can see then that the Club has a history, is currently thriving and most certainly has a future.

In recent years the club has put great efforts into encouraging the younger riders. In recognition of those efforts and our compliance with National Standards of Excellence, the Club has been awarded "Go Ride" status by British Cycling.

In addition, HM Government, recognising the responsible way in which we govern ourselves, has allowed us to register as a "Community Sports Club". This allows us taxation advantages which amounts to a lot of money over the years.

## **Club Events Notes**

All riders wishing to compete in the Club events are requested to fill in a standard CTT entry form. These can be obtained from the clubroom together with assistance on how to fill them in correctly.

Please complete the entry forms carefully as they are used to calculate handicaps for the Club events. If you are under 18yrs or over 40yrs (or nearly 40), please enter your date of birth in order that you can be considered for the awards specific to your category.

All under-18's must also complete the reverse side of the form and obtain Parent/Guardian's signature or they will not be allowed to compete.

Entries on the line will be accepted, but a form of consent must have been signed by Parent/Guardian prior to this.

All entries to all Club events must be accompanied by the appropriate entry fee.

When a Club event is run in conjunction with a Leicestershire Cyclists Association (L.C.A.) event the entry fee shall be increased by the L.C.A. levy.

When members enter L.C.A. events which do not incorporate Club events the Hon. Club Events Secretary must be informed by the members concerned (for L.C.A. purposes).

## **Rules**

### **Note**

Where the masculine gender is referred to it also includes the feminine, and is to be read as such throughout these rules

## **Memorandum**

1 The Club shall be called the "Leicestershire Road Club". The name "Leicester Off Road Club" is also registered.

2 Its objectives shall be encouragement and promotion of the riding of bicycles and similar machines.

3 Membership is open to anyone interested upon application, regardless of sex, age, disability, ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, religion or other beliefs. The club committee may refuse membership, or remove it, only for good cause such as conduct or character likely to bring the club or sport into disrepute. Appeal against refusal or removal may be made in accordance with rule 26.

4 The Club racing colours shall be Yellow, Red and Blue in the style approved by the Committee. The predominant colour shall be Yellow.

## **Constitution**

1 The Club shall hold an Annual General Meeting (AGM) in the January of each year. Any other general meeting shall be called a Special General Meeting (SGM).

2 Notice of the date and place of the AGM shall be given to all members at least 42 days prior to the date of that meeting.  
All items for inclusion on the agenda of an AGM, including officers' reports, must be given in writing to the Hon. General Secretary at least 28 days prior to that meeting.

3 A Special General Meeting may be called by either

- a) the Committee
- b) or by notice in writing signed by at least ten members being presented to the Hon. General Secretary. Such notice shall be accompanied by a deposit of £15 which may be refunded under the terms of 17(c).



- 4 Notice of a SGM shall be given to all members at least 21 days prior to the date of that meeting.
- 5 Items for inclusion on the agenda of a Special General Meeting must be submitted, in writing, to the Hon. General Secretary at least 14 days prior to the date of the meeting.
- 6 A General Meeting (both AGM and SGM) shall not be deemed to have been called unless
- a) a written notice of such a meeting and,
  - b) the agenda of that meeting has been sent to all members in sufficient time that the majority of members receive it at least
    - i) 10 days for a AGM, or
    - ii) 7 days for a SGMprior to that meeting. Note – this allows the use of email.
  - c) The accidental omission to give notice of a meeting to or the non-receipt of such notice by any person entitled to receive notice thereof shall not invalidate any resolution passed, or other proceedings, at any meeting.
  - d) Where more than one member shares the same postal address, only one notice of club activities events and advertisements and the like including but not limited to General Meetings need be sent to each postal address irrespective of the number of members resident at that address unless specifically requested in writing by the member concerned.
- 7 No member shall be nominated for any Club office or official position without prior consent of that member.
- 8 Each member (except second claim members) shall be entitled to vote at every General Meeting.
- 9 The Chairman of any meeting shall have a casting vote in addition to his normal vote.
- 10 No business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum is present.
- 11 A quorum at a General Meeting shall be 12 members.

- 12 If within half an hour of the appointed time of start of any meeting, a quorum is not present, then if the meeting is called by members, it shall be dissolved. Any other meeting shall be called again in 7 days by the most practical method. Note – this allows the use of email. If at a recalled meeting a quorum is not present within half an hour then the members present shall form quorum.
- 13 The President may be Chairman of all meetings. If the President or Chairman is not present within a quarter of an hour of the appointed time of start, then the members present shall appoint one of themselves Chairman.
- 14 The office of President shall not be held by one person for more than five consecutive years. When two years have elapsed with a new President in office, a past President shall become eligible for re-election.
- 15 The Chairman's decision on all matters of procedure shall be final.

- 16 The business of an Annual General Meeting shall consist of:
- a) Minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting.
  - b) Officers reports.
  - c) Consideration of the examined balance sheets and accounts
  - d) Election of officers.
  - e) Election of Management Committee.
  - f) Fixing of the Club Racing Calendar for the current year.
  - g) Any alterations or additions to the Club Memorandum, Constitution, Bye-Laws and Appendix.
  - h) Any other relevant business that may be properly transacted at an Annual General Meeting.
- 17 All business at a General Meeting shall be declared carried by a simple majority of the votes cast with the following exceptions which will require two-thirds of the votes cast:
- a) Any resolution to alter or add to the Memorandum, Constitution, and Bye-Laws
  - b) A motion for leave to discuss business not on the agenda,
  - c) A motion for the return of a deposit lodged under Rule 3 of this Constitution.
- 18 A copy of the minutes of each AGM and SGM shall be sent to every member within 28 days of that meeting.
- 19 The Club shall be run by a Management Committee consisting of:
- a) Hon. Chairman
  - b) Hon. General Secretary
  - c) Hon. Treasurer
  - d) Hon. Membership Secretary
  - e) Hon. Publicity Secretary
  - f) Hon. Newsletter Editor
  - g) Hon. Club Events Secretary
  - h) Hon. Club Captain
  - i) Four or more other members

The President shall have the right to attend, speak and vote at any meeting.

- 20 The Club officers shall consist of the following where 'C' denotes Committee position.
- a) President C
  - b) Chairman C
  - c) Hon. General Secretary C
  - d) Hon. Treasurer C
  - e) Hon. Membership Secretary C
  - f) Hon. Publicity Secretary C
  - g) Hon. Social Secretary C
  - h) Hon. Club Captain C
  - i) Hon. Dinner Secretary
  - j) Hon. Clubroom Secretary C
  - k) Hon. Newsletter Editor C
  - l) Hon. Club Events Secretary C
  - m) Hon. Clothing Secretary C
  - n) Welfare Officer C
  - o) Webmaster C
  - p) Quartermaster C
  - q) Hon. Open Events Secretary
  - r) The Hon. Delegates to all bodies to which the Club is affiliated and entitled to send delegates
  - s) The Hon. Club Handicapper
  - t) The Hon. Examiners of Accounts. There shall be two Examiners of Accounts. One shall retire each year. They need not be members of the Club. The Hon. Treasurer cannot act in this capacity.
  - u) The Hon. Club Coach
  - v) The Hon. Trophies Steward
  - w) Assistant Club Captain

Any Club Officers not elected to the Management Committee may be invited to Management meetings to give reports as and when necessary.

- 21 A quorum at committee meetings shall be six members.
- 22 The committee shall meet on the second Monday of every month at 7.00pm or at any other time and date at the discretion of the Committee.
- 23 Any committee member absent without reasonable excuse from three consecutive meetings shall have his/her seat declared vacant.

- 24 The committee shall manage the Club's affairs including:
- a) Use of Club property and funds.
- I. The property and funds of the Club cannot be used for the direct or indirect private benefit of members other than as reasonably allowed by the Rules and all surplus income or profits are reinvested in the club.
  - II. The Club may provide sporting and related social facilities, sporting equipment, coaching, courses, insurance cover, medical treatment, away-match expenses, post match refreshments and other ordinary benefits of Community Amateur Sports Clubs as provided for in the Finance Act 2002.
  - III. The Club may also in connection with the sports purposes of the Club:
    - (a) Sell and supply food, drink and related sports clothing and equipment;
    - (b) Employ members (though not for competing) and remunerate them for providing goods and services, on fair terms set by the Committee without the person concerned being present;
    - (c) Pay for reasonable hospitality for visiting teams and guests.
  - IV. Indemnify the Committee and members acting properly in the course of the running of the Club against any liability incurred in the proper running of the Club (but only to the extent of its assets).
    - b) Discipline of members.
    - c) Replacement and appointment of officers.
    - d) The Committee shall be able to propose a member for Honorary Life Membership to the next General Meeting. A secret ballot amongst the members present at that General Meeting requires a simple majority of the votes cast to validate the award. The reasons for proposing the award must be published in the Agenda of the General Meeting. Any club member can suggest any other club member to the Committee for consideration for this award.
    - e) Election of new members. Election to membership shall be by simple majority
    - f) Awarding of Club trophies.
    - g) All other relevant business.
    - h) The Committee will have due regard to the law on disability discrimination and child protection

- 25 The committee shall have the power to expel or otherwise censure any member found guilty of misconduct or whose character is likely to bring the club or the sport into disrepute. Appeal against any such decision may be made in accordance with rule 26
- 26 All Club members shall have the right of appeal against any decisions made against them by the committee. The appeal shall be heard at a Special General Meeting, or the Annual General Meeting if convenient. Such an appeal shall be lodged in the hands of the Hon. General Secretary, in writing, within 14 days of notification of suspension or disciplinary action. The appellant shall forward with the notice of appeal the sum of £5, the fee being forfeited in the event of the meeting hearing the appeal considering it frivolous.
- 27 The committee shall have the power to appoint any member to any vacant official position to a maximum of three vacancies in any one year.
- 28 The committee shall have the power to decide all matters not provided for in this Memorandum, Constitution, Bye-Laws and Appendix.
- 29 All committee business shall be declared carried by a simple majority of the votes cast except motions of procedure, which shall require two-thirds of the votes cast.
- 30 The committee's decisions and interpretations of this Memorandum, Constitution, Bye-Laws and Appendix shall be final. Where there is any conflict between any of the above Rules and any other rule or rules the key rules (Memorandum 3, Constitution 24a & 33) will take priority. Interpretation of all rules must be consistent with the statutory requirements for CASCs (which means Community Amateur Sports Clubs as first provided for by the Finance Act 2002).
- 30a The Minutes of each meeting shall be available to the members at the clubroom.

### **Trustees**

- 31 The Trustees shall be four in number elected at an Annual General Meeting, who shall be in office until the expiry date of any new lease of the Clubroom site, unless the member no longer wants to be a trustee, ceases to be a club member, or dies. All vacancies thus arising shall be filled by election at the next Annual General Meeting. Currently the Trustees are David Binks, Janet Preston, Glenn Coltman and Roger Nixon.
- 32 The Trustees shall be responsible for observing the terms of the lease and shall have such powers as are necessary to direct the committee to comply with those terms.

### **Dissolution of the Club**

- 33 Dissolution of the Club
- a) The club may be dissolved by a resolution of not less than three-quarters of the members of the club present and voting at a General Meeting called for that purpose.
- In the event of the dissolution of the club any assets remaining after all liabilities have been discharged shall be passed to other Leicester or Leicestershire cycling clubs having CASC status, a registered cycling charity, or British Cycling: (Cycle Sports Governing Body).

**BYE-LAWS**  
**Membership and subscriptions**

- 1 Membership applications must be made on the appropriate form.  
2 Annual subscriptions categories shall be as follows:  
Adult - Over 18 years of age.  
Under 18 - Under 18\* years of age.  
Second Claim - No new applications accepted.  
Family - up to 2 adults and any number of under 18\* yrs  
members in the same family (all any activity).

\* Under 18 years of age on the day of joining or January 1<sup>st</sup> of the renewal year.

Membership benefits for the various subscription categories are listed under "Benefits to Members" as revised and issued from time to time by the management committee

- 3 The age of new members on joining shall decide the rate of subscription payable for that year.
- 4 The Membership Year runs from 1st January to 31st December. Any membership application after 31 July will be subject to 50% membership fee for the remainder of the Membership Year.
- 4a Membership renewal will commence on 1 December and end on 31 January
- 5 Life members shall be entitled to free membership.
- 6 After payment of the 25th consecutive annual subscription a member shall become an Ordinary Life Member, and shall receive a certificate to honour their 25 years continuous membership of the Club.
- 7 If any member's subscription is not paid by 31st January then that member shall, at the committee's discretion, cease to be a member.
- 8 Any member wishing to resign shall give notice in writing to the Membership Secretary before 31 January. Unless such notice is received that member shall be held responsible for their subscription.
- 9 Members shall be entitled to wear a Club badge or use a Club transfer.



- 10 Members shall be entitled to compete in the Club's name in any event recognised by the Club.
- 10b Members competing in events run under the rules of the British Schools Cycling Association may do so without infringing their club membership rights.
- 10c Members, who are full time students at University or other establishment of further education, are permitted to represent the Club of the establishment during term time without infringing their club membership rights.
- 10d A minimum £30 top prize shall be awarded at open events and prizes are also be awarded for veterans (over 40yrs) on standard (using the VTTA standards applicable at the time of the event).

- 11 Members shall be entitled to wear the official Club racing attire. Any member reported as being dressed in a manner which throws discredit on the Club will be liable to be summoned before the committee, who shall take such action as is necessary.
- 12 Active members shall be members of either BC or CTC at the discretion of the committee. Members must pay their own appropriate subscriptions.
- 13 Members may attack Club records.
- 14 At the end of the racing season all paid-up racing members shall be issued with a pro-forma to complete and return, before 31st October, regarding their racing performances of the past season, thereby enabling the committee to award the various trophies more easily, having details of riders performances to hand.
- 15 All racing members must give notification to the Club's Publicity Secretary (or his/her delegate) of their racing result by the Monday evening following the event. Failure to comply with this rule may result in the non payment of any incentive payment for that event should it be awarded.
- 15A In order to qualify for racing points under the points allocation scheme, the claimant must have competed in the event wearing race clothing carrying the current sponsors approved logo.
- 16 Any member, Social or otherwise, who is riding 1st claim for another club, wishing to ride 1st claim for the Leicestershire Road Club shall apply to the committee.
- 17 Members who are first claim members of any other cycle racing club shall not be eligible to speak or vote at General Meetings of the Leicestershire Road Club. This category of member to be known as 'Second Claim'. They will pay the same annual subscription as, and enjoy all the other membership benefits of, Social Members.

### **Financial Year**

- 18 The financial year of the Club shall end on 30 November of each year, but individual officer's accounts and balance sheets shall be submitted to the Hon. Treasurer by 31 October each year.

- 18a The Treasurer is responsible for the funds of the Leicestershire Road Club – Leicester Off Road Club and shall keep a proper record of income and expenditure.
- A bank account of the club shall be maintained in the name of the Leicestershire Road Club at a recognised Clearing Bank and shall be operated by two signatories, one of whom shall be the Treasurer, and the other normally the Chairman. Two further members of the Management Committee shall also be authorised, as a signatory to act when one of the others for any reason is unable to sign.

## **Record Attempts**

### **General**

- 19 Appropriate days notice to be given and £1 to be paid for all private attempts on Club records.

### **Road**

- 20 Road records may be broken during the riding of B.C., C.T.T. or Club events. Any other attempt shall be a private attempt and shall be ridden on an out and back basis. A team record shall be established or broken only in C.T.T. open or semi-open events.
- 21 No roads to be ridden more than twice, exception being made only where a short distance is necessary at junctions to reach roads not already used (C.T.T. events excepted).
- 22 On entry being made to the Hon. Club Event Secretary for any place to place record attempt, 1 copy of the route the rider proposes to take must be forwarded with the entry. This entry may stand for any other record attempt that year, but the Hon. Club Event Secretary must be notified at least 48 hours before any further attempt.
- 23 Checks may be provided by members or evidence on checking cards issued by the Hon. Club Event Secretary may be obtained from responsible persons, such evidence to be in the hands of the Hon. Club Event Secretary within 7 days of completion of the ride.
- 24 All new records must be claimed in writing by the member concerned. Each claim to be supported by the necessary evidence in the form of the official results sheets or signed timekeeper certificates in the case of a private record attempt. Team records need only be claimed by one team member, preferably the team leader. All claims should be submitted for the committee's consideration before 31 October in each year.
- 25 The onus of proof of any ride rests with the rider and should the committee require further proof of the ride than that afforded by the

checking card the rider must pay the Hon. Club Event Secretary such sum as will cover his expenses in making the necessary enquiries.

- 26 A member may have the assistance of friends for checking at fixed points or by following in a car at a distance of not less than 100 yards.
- 27 A car may be used for all purposes connected with a record attempt, provided that such a car has on board;
- a) the official timekeeper timing the event or,
  - b) an observer previously approved by the Hon. General Secretary as credible and independent.
- 28 All time trial attempts must be ridden under either C.T.T. or R.R.A. regulations as appropriate. Except that providing Bye-Law 27 is adhered to, the following car may pass a rider once in the first 25 miles and once in every subsequent 25 miles during a private record attempt.

### Track

- 29 Track records may be broken during Open, League, Club promotions and private attempts.
- 30 Riders of tandems must both be members of the Leicestershire Road Club.
- 31 No member may attempt a Club record until his subscription for that year has been paid.
- 32 The Hon. Treasurer shall draw up a list of paid-up racing members at the beginning of each racing season and present this to the Hon. Club Event Secretary. Only members whose names appear on this list shall be allowed to ride in Club events. this list shall be kept up to date by the Treasurer and Hon. Club Event Secretary.
- 33 For any private record attempt such entry must state the track on which the attempt is to be made on. This entry may stand for any other

attempts that year, but the Hon. Club Event Secretary or appointed official must be notified at least 48 hours before any further attempt or change of track.

- 34 A record of the performance should be notified to the committee before 31 October of that year.
- 35 The onus of proof of any ride rests with the rider and should the committee require further proof of the ride than that afforded by the official form the rider must pay the Hon. Club Event Secretary such sum as will cover expenses in making the necessary enquiries.
- 36 A member may have the assistance of friends for checking fixed points.
- 37 All record attempts must be ridden under BC Rules of Racing in any form of recognised competition as appropriate and all references to BC committee will for the purposes of Club attempts refer to the Club committee.
- 38 No claims shall be considered unless the ride has been made in the presence of an official observer who shall be appointed by the Hon. General Secretary, or in his absence a member of the committee and timed by at least two approved timekeepers who have watches or approved digital timers which possess current certificates. For open events the result sheet for the event or a declaration by the Chief Commissaire shall be an acceptable substitute for an appointed club observer. Where two timekeepers are engaged and the watches disagree the slower time shall be taken. Where three timekeepers are engaged the middle time or, if two of the three agree, the agreed time shall be taken.
- 39 The following times and distances are those recognised for track record attempts.

### **British Schools Cycling Association Events.**

- 40a Young person age related records may be claimed for the set distance races permitted under B.S.C.A. rules of racing. Set distance roller racing times are included for purposes of young persons' records.
- 40b All record attempts must be ridden under B.S.C.A. rules in B.S.C.A. events.

40c All claims for new records must be by the young person or their guardian supported by written evidence in the form of an official competition result sheet.

- If an award or trophy has been won in accordance with the published criterion, it shall be awarded in accordance with that criterion, and the Committee shall have no power to alter that. However, if an award or trophy has not automatically been won on that basis, the Committee is empowered, at its sole discretion and for that year only, to reallocate that award or trophy for any other reason it feels fit. This discretionary power shall not extend to trophies awarded based on set distances or times, which shall remain sacrosanct.

### *UNDER 12 YEARS*

"Under 12 yrs" means before the 12th birthday on the day of the event or events.

### Under 12 Cyclo Cross

Awarded annually by the committee to the member considered to have been the best under 12 yrs Cyclo Cross performer during the year. - There are **two** trophies – best **Boy** and best **Girl**

### *UNDER 16YEARS*

"Under 16 yrs" means before the 16th birthday on the day of the event(s) events.

### The Massed Start Trophy (for under 16s)

Awarded annually by the committee to the member considered to have been the best under 16yrs massed start road racing performer during the year.

### The Juveniles Time Trial Championship Cup

Awarded annually to the juvenile member with the fastest time on scratch in a designated club time trial. The designated event to be decided by the committee at the start of the club events series for that season.

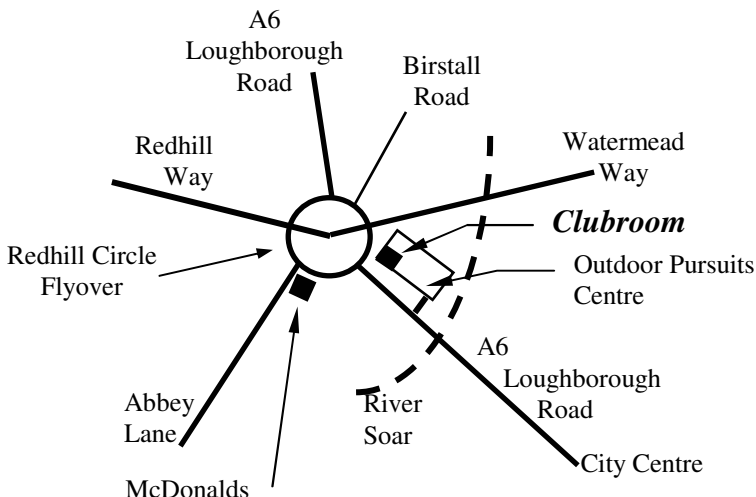
